

## Living in Hope

**W**e all know about Mary, Joseph, the shepherds and wise men. But do you know about Anna and Simeon? They also played a part in the Christmas story.

Anna was a prophet, which means that she spoke the Word of God. Luke tells us that she was very old – 84 years of age. Life had not been easy for Anna. She had been married for only seven years when her husband died. For the rest of her life she remained a widow.

Anna never left the temple. She devoted herself to prayer and worship. Day and night, she waited for the coming of the Messiah until one day, he appeared. Mary and Joseph came to the temple to dedicate the baby Jesus. With great joy, Anna recognized the Christ child and she, “gave thanks and spoke about the child to all who were looking forward to the redemption of Jerusalem” (Luke 2:38).

Simeon was righteous and devout. Luke tells us, “It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not die before he had seen the Lord’s Messiah.” All his life, Simeon waited to see the Messiah. But now, he was close to death. Time was running out.

And then one day, Mary and Joseph brought the baby Jesus to the temple. Instantly, Simeon recognized the Christ child. Taking the baby in his arms, he praised God and said: “Sovereign Lord, as you have promised, you may now dismiss your servant in peace. For my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the sight of all


nations: a light for the revelation to the Gentiles, and the glory of your people Israel.” (Luke 2:28-32).

Anna and Simeon lived in a dark time. Conquered by Rome, Israel was no longer a great nation. They were exploited and oppressed. The land of Judea was ruled by King Herod, a maniacal and ruthless dictator. The future seemed utterly hopeless.

And yet, Anna and Simeon lived in hope! Their hope was not based on anything in this world, but on God’s Word and promise that one day, a Messiah would come and bring the light of salvation not just to Israel but to

the entire world.

Today, we are living in dark times. Many people feel anxiety and depression. It often seems like the darkness is growing. It is easy to feel hopeless, to sink into despair.



Anna and Simeon are an example for us to follow. They teach us what it means to live by faith. They trusted in God's promise, and their faith was rewarded. They put their hope in God, and their hope was not disappointed.

Like those ancient saints, we must live in hope and expectation! Like those ancient saints, we must dedicate ourselves to prayer and worship. Christ has come into the world and he will come again. Once you have seen the light of dawn, you will not fear the darkness.

Advent 2022 is going to be eventful, to say the least. Because of that, I want to take a moment and walk through the season with you to make sure we both know what is happening when.

Sunday, November 27 is the first Sunday in Advent and our worship times are normal. Peter will be focusing on Christ the King this season and it is going to be a great journey through the weeks of preparation for Christmas. The second Sunday in Advent falls on December 4, and there will be no 10 a.m. service due to the Congregational meeting.

December 11 is the Children's Christmas Musical – *The Nightshift Before Christmas*. There will be one service at 10 a.m. in the Ark with a time of fellowship and celebration immediately following. On Friday and Saturday, December 16 and 17, we will be offering Part One of *Messiah*, by G.F. Handel. More on that in a moment. On Sunday December 18, we will worship in our regular Sunday morning schedule. Next is worship on Christmas Eve (Saturday, December 24) with three candlelight services at 5, 6:30, and 8 p.m. in the Sanctuary.

On Sunday, December 25, we celebrate Christmas day with one service of worship at 10 a.m. in the Sanctuary. What a delight to be able to spend an hour or so with your church family on Christmas day rejoicing and celebrating the greatest gift we could ever receive! We will be on the same worship schedule the very next Sunday, which is New Years Day, with one service at 10 a.m. in the Sanctuary. I pray that we stay in tune to the unique schedule this Advent brings. Through it all, we will celebrate and praise God for the wonders of His love!

## MORE ON MESSIAH

Again, *Messiah* will be offered Friday and Saturday December 16 and 17 at 7:30 p.m. in the Sanctuary. Joining the Sanctuary Choir will be several local vocalists bringing the Chorus to over 40 singers! Also, we will have a 13 piece chamber orchestra, harpsi-

# Activating God Space

A.K.A. SHARING THE GOOD NEWS

We have been highlighting some ways that people at LPC are activating God Space. We set out to do this for a couple of articles, but there are so many good stories, that we just can't stop! I love hearing all the different ways people create a little "God Space." Here are some snippets from a conversation I had with John and Fran Morris:

Recently, Fran Morris was at Walmart looking for some fabric for a sewing project. She finally found what she wanted, but, being vertically challenged, was not able to reach it, and could not find an employee to help. A very kind gentleman came along and offered to reach it for her. She told him that he was a "God-send" and that opened up a God conversation. The man was already a believer, but there were other people around listening to their conversation as well. You never know how God will speak to someone – maybe through a casual conversation at Walmart!

John and Fran had an experience at their last family get together. They have a relative with a biomedical degree, and he was talking about his work, cell regeneration. It was fascinating, and he was very excited about it – so it was natural when Fran asked, "Does it ever make you stop and think about God's creation?" He said, "Yeah, sometimes." He is not a believer, and they did not push him, but just let him think about that. (Another spiritual appetizer!)

One of the best things John says he got from the God Space Seminar was the phrase "tell me your story." That is a phrase that is so natural that it is easy to start a conversation, which will usually end up with an opportunity for more questions to get to know that person better – and quite often into a God conversation! You don't have to be ordained, or trained! You just have to be interested in the other person!

I wish I had room to share all the stories they told me. But one thing I took away from our conversation, was that they are truly interested in other people, and that caring comes across. Let's ask someone this week, "Tell me your story..." and listen to them with interest.

## 2023: WHAT'S YOUR NEW YEAR RESOLUTION?


Giving up bad habits? Trying to develop positive habits? Truly becoming a disciple of Christ?

The Great Commission (Matthew 28: 18-20) calls on believers to "go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you." Being a "disciple" means following "disciplines." Christian disciplines are the means by which we seek, savor, and enjoy Jesus Christ and experience God's grace. What have been called "spiritual disciplines" are the various channels God has appointed for regularly supplying His people and His church with spiritual power.

To be a disciple is to receive and use gracious gifts and signs that God is at work in us. Disciplines are not simply pursuing knowledge or performing actions as a duty, but rather paths to accessing more joy, of experiencing more enjoyment in Jesus' paths by knowing His Word, seeking His ear and listening to His voice in prayer, and enjoying and working for His glory in a fellowship of believers.

This winter, Pastor Stephanie will lead a Wednesday Nights Together class about Christian Disciplines designed as a place to start for beginners and a path to grow for those seasoned in the faith. Together, we will engage in hearing His voice, having His ear, and belonging to His body.

Learn about how to keep a "resolution" that is truly life-changing!





On November 13, LPC parents met to discuss how to raise their students to have mature faith and to be the primary discipler of their children. We looked at the Shema (Deuteronomy 6:4-9) and how parenting young Christians is like chiseling small pieces off to form the hidden sculpture in the stone. We discussed parenting with persistence in family faith practice and personal faith modeling so we can form a family culture that points them towards Christian adulthood. Our primary focus centered on imagining who we wanted our children to be when they are 35. What are our goals for them? What are our spiritual goals for them? Who do we want them to be? From there we looked at current practices we can do to give our students a foundation and to help chisel or form our children into the likeness of Jesus Christ.



We want all parents to join us at these meetings. We believe that we are better together and invite any parent into our community. Do you have a newborn baby and/or a college student? 


# Wednesday Nights Together Kids Armor of God

During the Fall session of WNT, the children were all learning about the Armor of God. Some really good discussions occurred, and some basic Biblical truths were taught. By the end of the sessions, the children had learned that God is the source of all truth and the Bible is where we go to learn about that truth. They also learned that we are to love God with all our hearts and do what is right in His sight, and the Holy Spirit helps to guide us. Another point discussed was how we are to go and tell others about Jesus. This is so important because He is the only way for anyone to be saved and have eternal life. The kids were also able to take in that faith and what it means to trust in Jesus and his power, love, and plan for our lives. All the classes made shields of faith, and in the 3rd and 4th grade class, the kids drew and wrote things on their shields about what their faith means to them. They drew Bibles (our source of truth and knowledge about God), themselves (Jesus loves us), the cross (Jesus died for us), nature (God created everything), the world (God holds the whole world in his hands and He is in charge) and more. They really put thought into what they did. It was so cool to see them really thinking about and discussing their faith in this way. Finally, we learned that the first piece of armor that we need to put on is the Helmet of Salvation-we need to accept the gift of salvation. We talked about how to do that and I know that at least 2 children gave their lives to Jesus at one of our meetings. Praise God!

## A Disciple is Present

At LPC Encounter Student Ministries we believe that God has chosen to be present with his people. In the Old Testament his “Shekinah glory” dwelt with his people through a fiery cloud. The people of Israel knew God was there. Just as the divine Presence dwelled in a fairly normal tent called the “tabernacle” before the Temple in Jerusalem was built, so did the Presence dwell in the fairly plain man who was Jesus. “He had no beauty or majesty to attract us to him, nothing in his appearance that we should desire him” (Isaiah 53:2). In Colossians 2:9 we read “in Christ all the fullness of the Deity lives in bodily form.” Jesus is the dwelling place of God’s glory. He is God with his people and we hear Jesus say to his disciples, “Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father” (John 14:9). Jesus is God with us. Jesus has come to be with us. As adults leading teenagers we see that we must follow Jesus not only where he goes but how he goes. Jesus’ ministry is a ministry of supernatural presence in relatively normal ways. Jesus lived life with his disciples and was present with his friends in grief and pain. Jesus calls us to a ministry of presence with people. Our leaders do this in plain everyday ways with our teens. Working on homework with our teens, grabbing coffee and sitting reading the Bible together. We celebrate the joys of teenage life and we mourn and grieve with students who are struggling. Through it all we go to meet teenagers where they are present in everyday ways because that is what Jesus did for us. 

# Community Outreach and Candy

October may seem like a distant memory as we prepare for celebrating the birth of Jesus. However, it wasn't too long ago that our church opened its doors to the community for our annual Candy Hunt. This year's theme was the Candy Carnival, complete with a Big Top Ring in the Narthex, and carnival type games throughout the church's campus. It was a joy to be a part of such an exciting event. Thank you to everyone who donated candy, helped decorate a room, worked as a greeter or direction giver, or any of the countless other ways in which our church family stepped up to serve.

While we could have been satisfied with just opening our doors, being a friendly place, and sending our community on their way, there was a bigger vision in the hearts of the Family Ministry Team. The goal of any sort of outreach event is to introduce people to God. We desire that our community would know Jesus Christ as their Lord, and that they would desire to serve Him with their whole lives. So of course, we had fun, like multiple high school students riding unicycles in costume, but ultimately our goal was to begin relationships with these families walking through our church so that we could begin to talk with them about God. This was accomplished by providing space in the Ark for parents to connect and asking for contact information that we could then follow up with. The Children's Team prepared gift bags for every family, which included an invitation to the Advent Wreath Making Dinner, and our Christmas Eve services. In total we had over 150 community families come to our event, and we gathered contact information from 75 brand new families.

The hope in all that we do is to connect our local community to our God. We would ask for your continued prayers as the Youth, Children, and Adult Ministry teams work together to minister to these new individuals that we now have a beginning relationship with. It is a joy to be a part of the growing outreach ministry to our community, and a blessing to be a part of a church who cares so deeply for sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

## LPC Adopts Villages in India

Three years ago, our church adopted five villages in India. In partnership with India Gospel League and other churches in southwest Ohio, we funded an effort to plant churches in the rural villages of Ghot, Irular, Manjayankadu, Pimpri and Verakui, located south of Mumbai. In addition, the goal was to provide schools, medical care and promote economic development.

Three years later, these five villages are flourishing. Recently, India Gospel League sent us some statistics that show the impact of this project. As a result, many hearts and lives have been transformed spiritually and physically:

- 613 students have joined Children's Gospel clubs
- 133 students are in Christian Day Care
- 1,064 Bibles have been distributed
- 291 new believers have come to faith in Jesus Christ
- 62 new baptisms
- 1,024 treated in medical camps
- 1,693 new moms & their babies received pre and post-natal care
- 227 micro-loan recipients
- 1,077 participants in income generation projects
- 436 women have joined transformation groups

All of this was accomplished in just three years! Please pray for India Gospel League as they seek to bring the Good News of Jesus to rural villages in India in the face of increasing persecution.

## ANGEL TREE


