To God be the Glory!

For 21 years I have served as your senior pastor. Very soon, that will be ending. On January 14, I will preach my last sermon before I retire to begin a new season in life.

When we arrived at LPC for the very first time, I remember saying to Beth, "I think we've found the Prom-

ised Land!" Those words turned out to be true. From the very first day, you embraced me and my family and made us feel welcome. What a joy it's been to share the Gospel and our lives with all of you!

At the end of the day, the test of pastoral leadership is whether you left the church better than you found it. Looking back, I am amazed at all the LORD has accomplished in this congregation. Here are some of the major milestones:

- Student Ministry; construction of the Atrium; renovation of the old fellowship hall; remodeling of the sanctuary and completion of the upstairs kitchen.
- Expanded the mission involvement of our church.
 We built churches in Mexico, a Christian school in Kenya, drilled wells in Africa and sent short-term mis
 - sion teams to respond to floods and hurricanes. In addition, we started our feeding ministry, Angel Tree and donating baby items for women with crisis pregnancies.
 - Provided financial support for the Five-Point-Seven Church in Detroit to build an outdoor basketball court.
 - In 2013 we completed a \$465,000 project to restore our pipe organ, install new pews and remodel the chancel of our historic sanctuary.

- Concerned by the theological drift of the Presbyterian Church (USA), we voted in 2011 to leave that denomination and unite with the Evangelical Presbyterian Church. Ninety-seven percent voted in favor of leaving which is a testimony to our faith and unity.
- In 2006 we embarked on \$3.5 million building campaign that included the new office and classroom wing; the stage area in the Ark; additional space for
- Thanks to the wise and courageous leadership of our Session, we weathered the crisis of the Covid Epidemic, which caused so much fear and disruption.
- Provided funding to Genesis EPC in Mercedes, Texas in the Rio Grande Valley to help them construct a church building.

- Launched "Wednesday Nights Together," to provide a midweek opportunity for food, fellowship and discipleship opportunities for adults and children.
- Started the annual all-church picnic, spring rummage sale and the annual missions golf tournament.
- Hired our first full-time business administrator, student ministry director and part-time children's ministry director. In addition, we hired a summer intern to reach out to college students.
- Started a monthly prayer meeting.
- Challenged our congregation to read the Bible in 90 days and to continue reading through the Bible every year.
- Lay leadership of the church has grown significantly, with people using their gifts and engaging in ministry, including worship leadership.
- Developed a closer relationship with the LPC Preschool to make sure it is in alignment with the mission of the church and accountable to the Session.
- Expanded the role of our deacons ministry to host the receptions for grieving families after memorial services.
- Created a live nativity and open house as an outreach during Lebanon's Christmas carriage parade.
- Resumed publication of our Advent and Lenten devotionals, written by members of our congregation.

Above all, this church has remained faithful to Jesus Christ. We have not caved or conformed to the pressure of our culture, but have proclaimed the Word of God and the truth of the Gospel -- that salvation is found in Jesus Christ alone. To God be the glory!

An Overwhelming Gift

This past October, our church held its second annual food drive for Warren County Career Center. Last year, the Reach Out Team decided they wanted to "adopt" WCCC, provide the school with tangible help, and show love and support for the faculty there. This sponsorship was so impactful to WCCC that Reach Out decided to build our relationship with them again this year. As we met with one of the office directors, we were told that the food pantry was getting low again. He shared that over 1/3 of their students are on free or reduced lunch, and that often times students were taking home food not just for themselves, but for their siblings as well. With over 900 students at WCCC, this number was staggering.

Unsurprisingly, when the request was made to LPC to help fill the food pantry up again, our church family stepped up in a phenomenal way. We donated over 645 food packages! There were over 85 cans of prepared pasta, 90 boxes of Mac and Cheese, and so many other necessities. We completely filled one of the offices with all of the donations. Our Annual Women's retreat also created over 100 hygiene kits to include as well. These kits included soaps, deodorants, and other personal care extras that the school was needing to provide for some of the students.

With both the hygiene kits and all of the food, it was a parade of boxes as we dropped everything off at

the school. I even heard students in the hallway asking each other as we brought things in, "Woah, where did all of that food come from? Did someone get that for us?" One of the women in the office began weeping as boxes came in, and all of the guidance counselors came out of their offices to see what all the commotion was about. It was such a gift to be able to say to each one of these people, "Hi, we are from Lebanon Presbyterian Church, and we love you guys."

Reach Out's ultimate goal is to build relationships with our community that ultimately point people to Christ and His love for them. What a special gift it is to be welcomed into a public school, to care for their students and staff, and to be open about how we just want to love them because Jesus loves them even more. This obviously wouldn't have been possible without the overwhelming support from our LPC family. Thank you for all of the support and donations. It is truly a blessing to be a part of such a generous and caring congregation.

Ensuring the safety of our participants is our top priority. Rest assured, Xocenpich is a secure destination, far removed from any areas of concern. With our long-standing relationship and respect within the community, we are confident in providing a safe and enriching experience. In proximity to medical facilities and major cities, we are well-prepared for any unforeseen circumstances.



Who's Invited? The Encounter Yucatan Mission Trip welcomes all current 8th - 12th graders, college students, young adult alumni, and parents. 




