As we are in a season of new beginnings under the providence and provision of our faithful God, here are a few things I want you to know about me.



This means that I preach most often verse by verse through a book of the Bible. You will notice that I use the English Standard Version (ESV) of the Holy Scriptures in worship. I would encourage you to bring your Bible to worship so you can handle your personal copy of God's Word. If you are in the market for a new Bible, I'd recommend getting a copy of the ESV so that the version we hear in worship is the same version you are reading in your



own quiet time.

Over the next months and years, we will get to know one another very well. You will learn much more about me and the ways I shepherd and lead, and I will learn about all of you. I am eager to know you and hear your stories of faith in Jesus. With every step and at every turn in this season of our ministry together, we will lean into God's faithfulness, knowing that he has brought us together for his very good and pleasing purposes.

May we bless his name for the glories of his grace and walk together to make him known in Lebanon and beyond.

Better Together

Here at LPC, we are proud to be Presbyterian. I mean, it's even in our name! However, while we love the stereotypical things of Presbyterianism (i.e. Committees, potlucks, things good and orderly), we sometimes miss the connectionalism that is one of the markers of our tradition and history. While pastors and Session have some connection because of Presbytery events, it is often guite isolating for the remainder of staff or volunteers doing ministry week in and week out. About a year ago, a group of pastors in our Presbytery and I felt this as many of us had transitioned from youth or children's ministry into leading those who are doing that ministry. In an effort to better equip and care for the children's, youth, and college directors and volunteers of our churches, we petitioned the Presbytery to create a new committee focused on connecting the "Next Gen" workers.

At our last Presbytery meeting in February, this committee was officially approved! We had a lunch before the meeting that any Next Gen worker could attend to get connected and share resources and ideas. This is something that we are hoping to provide at every presbytery meeting moving forward. It is a huge step forward in helping not only the individuals who are on church staff to stay connected but also a great resource for those churches that are too small to have staff outside of the Senior Pastor. The majority of the churches in the Midwest Presbytery are considered "small churches," or have less than 100 members. It is the hope of the Next Gen Committee that we can share resources with those churches that may have one or two volunteers doing their children's and youth ministry. We are so blessed at LPC to have an incredible staff and volunteers minister to our kids and youth, and the hope is to be able to share and support smaller churches as well.

Some of this work is already taking place, with a Midwest Presbytery Summer Camp taking place over the summer and at an annual Next Gen Workers Summit put on by the EPC. LPC is also leading the way in our partnership with 5.7 Church in Detroit and the mission trip our youth went on. Andrew and Tracy are already connecting with other Next Gen workers in our Presbytery. It has been a blessing to be able to be a part of change happening at the Presbytery level. I feel incredibly grateful to be a part of a church that believes in truly being connectional and being a part of helping other churches spread the Gospel of Jesus. Would you continue to pray for LPC's Next Gen Workers, as well as all of the volunteers and staff throughout the Midwest Presbytery as they minister to babies and college students alike for the sake of the Kingdom?

Encounter Leaders Thrived at Youth Leader Training in Nashville

In January, our Encounter Student Ministry saw three leaders—Meg Elliott, Daniel Frank, and Andrew Johnson embark on a transformative journey to Nashville for the Youth Leader Training (YLT), an empowering event organized by Reformed Youth Ministry since 2008. At LPC, investing in the next generation of church leaders is a priority, and we were thrilled to witness Daniel and Meg's growth in ministry leadership. During YLT, valuable connections were made with fellow EPC youth ministry workers who shared a common goal.

YLT Nashville, held at the Nelson Andrews Leadership Lodge at the Joe C. Davis YMCA Outdoor Center at Camp Widjiwagan from January 22 to 26, 2024, was more than just a conference—it was a gathering of passionate youth ministry leaders dedicated to equipping and reaching youth for Christ. The YLT experience revolved around three core pillars—**Equip**, **Connect**, **Encourage**—which laid the foundation for enriched knowledge, meaningful connections, and a rejuvenated spirit.

Equip: Enhancing Youth Ministry Strategies

YLT sessions provided our leaders with insights, tools, and strategies to enhance youth ministry effectiveness. Sessions like "Philosophy of Ministry" and "Non-anxious Leadership for Youth Ministry" deepened their understanding of theological assumptions and leadership approaches.

Connect: Building Lasting Relationships

YLT emphasized forging meaningful relationships. Encounter leaders connected with peers from diverse backgrounds, creating a network of support and collaboration that extended beyond the event, forming a community dedicated to a common ministry philosophy.

Encourage: Renewing Spirits with the Gospel

Renewal through the Gospel was a key focus of YLT. The sessions addressed real challenges faced by youth leaders, offering encouragement and motivation to continue serving students. The impactful plenary session on "Partnering with Parents in Ministry to Youth" highlighted the crucial role of parents in a teenager's faith journey.

Our Encounter leaders attended various sessions, gathering practical tips from Effective Teaching to "Frontline Trauma-Informed Care." These insights will aid in building dedicated volunteer teams and handling crisis effectively. Armed with a toolkit of knowledge, skills, and inspiration, our Encounter leaders are set to positively impact our youth. Committed to growth in biblical, theological, and strategic aspects, Encounter aims to cultivate a culture of healthy relationships, empowered leaders, and flourishing students. 

Our WNT Kids continue to learn about God's love and what it looks like to love others the way God does.

In the last couple of weeks, we've been learning that God's love is for everyone. We talked about the time when Jesus spoke to the Samaritan woman at the well. There was some really good discussion about how this was unusual because Jews and Samaritans did not like each other, a Jewish man would not have spoken to a strange woman in public, and this particular woman had a lifestyle that was sinful. Why would Jesus show love and compassion to this woman? What does this mean for us today?



In our experiment time, we learned that what people think and feel inside is not always what they show to us. The kids learned that God sees our hearts and knows all that we've been through and all of our thoughts, fears, and hurts. Even though

we can't know people completely like God does, when someone seems different or unfriendly, we need to think about how God would respond and show them the same kind of unconditional kindness and love.

Okay, so we should do that most of the time, right? But do we really need to share God's love with e-v-e-r-y-on-e? Hmmm...



Let me tell you, folks, we could all learn from the kids' responses. All the kids said YES, we do! Some discussed

how it can be hard to respond to others who are different from us with this kind of love. We said that we just need to keep trying and praying for our love to be more like God's. The first and second graders talked about how Jesus fed people, walked with people, talked with people, healed people, and loved them NO MATTER WHAT! They decided that we need to love like that!

Other classes, like our preschool class, responded with action and had a great time making "love cards" for a nursing care facility. The Engage 56 class also made cards and included encouraging scriptures in them. The 3rd and 4th graders made "Thank You Valentines" to encourage all our deacons, who spend so much time loving others like Jesus did.

All of the classes had great discussions and responded in some way by showing God's love to others. If only we

all had that kind of attitude to be intentional and to try to share God's love with others through our words and our actions, "NO MATTER WHAT!"




Attention 5th & 6th Grade Parents Engage 56 Event: The Amazing Grace Race Saturday, March 16 | 2 – 6:15 p.m.




Activating GOD SPACE

A.K.A. SHARING THE GOOD NEWS

YOU NEED TO READ THIS>>> In the current WNT *Loving People to Christ* class, the 3rd week was about the Holy Spirit. Presenters John & Fran Morris shared that the Holy Spirit is always attempting to get our attention so he can lead (Acts 1:8, Galatians 5:22-23).

John & Fran were praying that someone would come across their radar who was a believer with a story. At a Financial Review at a local bank, IT HAPPENED. John noticed the bracelet of the financial officer, Matt. John said, "What Would Jesus Do?" Immediately, Matt said, "I will tell you what He did for me." They listened as Matt so naturally shared his story of coming out of darkness into God's Holy Light and being transformed as a born-again Christian. Matt's testimony was genuine and spirit-filled.



They prayed with Matt. Matt also accepted their invitation to be a class guest speaker.

Here's Matt's story>>> Matt was raised in a faith-based family. He knew God but did not have a relationship with God. He went through the motions of memorized rituals and prayers but no Bible study. In high school, he endured the heartache and confusion of his clergyman/mentor being jailed for crimes committed in his ministry. Matt swore off religion. He told his fiancée that he would only believe what could be proven. As newlyweds, Matt was encouraged by his wife to attend the church she had grown up in. He relented with conditions and some fear.

From the moment Matt walked in, he was welcomed by the pastor; music was a live band with a praise team; prayers were off the cuff. He got something from the message and the Holy Spirit started working in his life. Matt got involved in a small group, praying in public and reading the Bible. Matt called it eye-opening when he realized that he could have a relationship with God. He has grown to be an enthusiastic disciple, having conversations with people like clients, friends and family.

We are all different in our approaches to evangelism: Matt finds many doors have been open by wearing his bracelet and creating God Space one person at a time; Fran & John find that prayer leads them to the right people. We are all learning that with the Holy Spirit leading, anything is possible.

- Approved Marriage School fundraising event on April 20, 2024.




